Local emergency officials in Cheyenne County have been notified that a food product was distributed within Cheyenne County starting last Friday, Aug. 19. The product has been recalled due to possible contamination and may contain Listeria. Officials are warning if you have the following products do not eat it and discard immediately.

Recalled products:
Rojo's Ultimate 7 Layer Dip, 36 oz. 35196-44162 with a use by date of 09-16-11 or before.
Fresh Food Concepts 5 Layer Dip, 32 oz. 29358-11272, with the use by date of 09-16-11 or before.

Please call your healthcare provider, local health department or hospital if you have eaten any of the above product and are experiencing the following symptoms: fever, vomiting, diarrhea or severe unusual headache. This warning is especially concerning for the elderly population and pregnant women or those with immune compromised illness and you need to contact your health provider immediately.

Use proper hygiene including washing hands before eating or after using the restroom. This will help in preventing any person to person transfer.

There are 24 girls out this year. "The 2011 team is starting fresh in many ways," said Coach Talley Morrow.

Last year, the coach played mostly eight girls and seven of them graduated in May. Returning of the eight is Kaitlin Figgins, who, last year, was All League for the second year.

Kaitlin will have a "new team" to play with, the coach said. We are working hard to catch up and making improvements where necessary.

Like St. Francis, many of the team's opponents also graduated talented players. I'm hoping that they will be "fresh" like we are, she said. We will face many tough opponents who have well-established traditions of beating us, so we have our work cut out for us!

Returning letter winners besides Figgins are Jacquelyn Ketzner, Lexi Hilt, Trista Orth and Christina Schoenrogge.

Morrow held a volleyball camp this summer which included fourth through sixth graders, seventh through eighth and ninth through 12 graders.

"It was great fun and almost everybody who is out was able to attend," Morrow said.

Eleven of the girls also participated in a summer league organized by Colby Community College volleyball coaches. A few of the girls went on to collegiate skill camp.

Last year's team finished the season with a 20-15 record. The year before, the record was 12-20, which, the coach said, was a pretty decent improvement on most of the previous years' records.

Like most teams, Coach Morrow said, we work hard every

day so that we can have as good of a season and final record as possible.

My goals are to have a successful season, she said, as well as the girls to enjoy their experience while being challenged every day. "I want to be the best coach I can be for them."

This is Coach Morrow's third year as head coach. Assistant coach is Jeff Olofson, who has been coaching for 19 years.

Both Morrow and Olofson attended the Kansas High School Activities Association's coaching school in Topeka the first week of August.

On Sept. 20, official enrollment deadline, the team will find out if they will be playing in the 1A or 2A tournament at the end of the season. Enrollment, as of Tuesday, appeared to be about the same or maybe a little higher than last year.

"I am expecting to play in the 2A sub-state again," she said. "Not that the state has divided the 1A into two divisions, though, either classification would be fine with me."

Coach Morrow stressed that it is very important and what helps the team is the support they receive from parents, other adults and students including boys, who show up at the gym or travel out of town to see the Ladies in action. Supporters are also encouraged to attend the open house at 7 p.m. at the high school on Friday.

"We are anticipating a good season," she said.

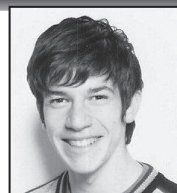
