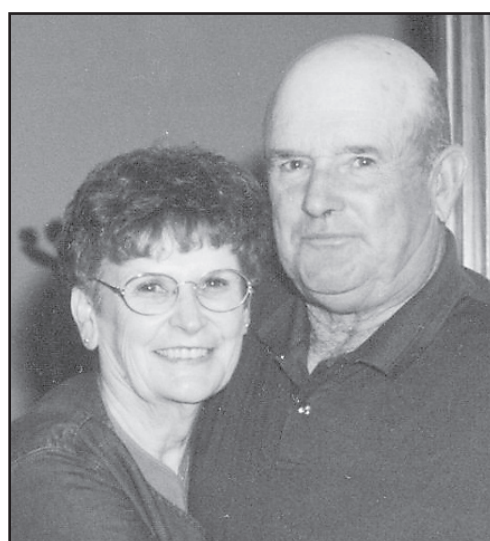

Kari Gilliland, county attorney, reported that at this time, no cases have been reported.

If you have the following products do not eat it and discard immediately.

- Recalled products: Rojo's Ultimate 7 Layer Dip, 36 oz. 35196-44162 with a use by date of 09-16-11 or before.
- Fresh Food Concepts 5 Layer

Dip, 32 oz. 29358-11272, with the use by date of 09-16-11 or before.

Mark your calendars for two upcoming programs which will be presented by the Cheyenne County Historical Society on Sunday, Sept. 18 and Sunday, Oct. 23.

Rod Laird, "Grandfather of the modern rebirth of atlatl use," will speak on Sept. 18 at 4 p.m. in the Old Country Church on U.S. 36. He will be talking about the Megafauna (large animals, mostly now extinct) of the Pleistocene (Ice Age), the Paleoamericans of Cheyenne County who hunted them, the weapon they used (the atlatl), and how a classroom learning activity in a Wyoming middle school became a worldwide sport. Rod plans to bring a Clovis biface found by his Uncle Chase Dunn on South Fork after the great flood of 1935. A biface is a flaked blade of stone that furnished flakes for tool-making. He'll also have lots of tools and artifacts, including atlatls. This presentation is open to everyone interested.

Sunday, Oct. 23, the Historical Society will host Audrey Kalivoda, at the St. Francis Public Library. She will preview her newest DVD, "Kansas, the Center of it All." This event will begin at 2 p.m. with a reception following.

## Free screening available for kids

A free screening for young children will be held starting at 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 7, starting at the First Christian Church. The screening is sponsored by the St. Francis school system and Northwest Kansas Educational Service Center.

This annual developmental screening is recommended for all young children, who have not yet entered kindergarten. Its purpose is to help parents be informed of their child's developmental levels and needs.

The screening assesses hearing, vision, fine and gross motor skills, concepts, plus speech and language. If the screening indicates a need; then arrangements can be made through the screening staff for additional help.

Parents are encouraged to accompany their children through the screening process so that parents and staff can share observations and discuss the results of the screening. A parent needs to allow 90 minutes for each child's screening.

If, as a parent, you cannot attend, you are welcome to make arrangements for your child to go through this worthwhile screening.
