Broadleaf weeds can be controlled

Lawn owners can fairly easily control some of the worst broadleaf weeds by applying the correct herbicide in fall.

"It's a seasonal job, though. You'll always have a few because these weeds are so good at spreading where they're not wanted," said Rodney St. John, turfgrass horticulturist with K-State Research and Extension.

Most broadleaf weeds are master seed makers, he said. Often, each plant can produce thousands of seeds that end up miles away. Seeds can stay viable in all kinds of soil for 30-plus years.

"Still, you can minimize dandelions, plantains and clovers in fall, he said. They're storing up energy for winter. A herbicide applied then will enter the plant and also travel down to the roots' food reserves, killing the entire plant"

Applications in late October or early November can control some troublesome winter-annual broadleaf weeds, as well, including chickweed and henbit. They sprout in fall and grow a bit, to gear up for next spring's invasion.

Mr. St. John said the traditional herbicides for controlling broadleaf weeds in fall include 2,4-D and a range of products that combine 2,4-D with MCPP and dicamba (e.g., Trimec, Weed-B-Gon, Weed-Out).

As with all herbicides, exactly following label directions is vital, he said. Incorrectly applied dicamba, for example, can harm tree and shrub roots. Sprays may not work if applied to turf with dry soil or on a day with temperatures below 50 degrees.

A newer product (such as Weed Free Zone, Speed Zone) combines the traditional ingredients with carfentrazone. It can widen fall's control window because it's both quicker than the traditional products and more effective in temperatures below 50 degrees.

But, all of these herbicides can damage new turf seedlings, Mr. St. John warned. Unless new grass plants have grown enough to be mowed two to three times, hand-digging weeds will be safer for the turf seedlings than spraying an herbicide.

Money gram dealer warns of scamming

Bud Erskin, Majestic Service owner, reported, after reading the grandparent scam article in the Nov. 17 issue, that he has had several incidents that were similar. One grandparent in particular, wanted to send a Money Gram. Mr. Erskin is the dealer for Money Gram.

We are trained to watch for possible scams such as the grandparent scam, he said.

The grandparent was insistent that he send the money, even though he tried to talk her out of

it. Money Gram was alerted to the amount of money and in the end, the grandparent got her money back. The grandchild was in no danger.

This doesn't always happen, Bud said. The scammers make the amount of money they are asking for to be attainable for most grandparents and it isn't an amount that raises red flags.

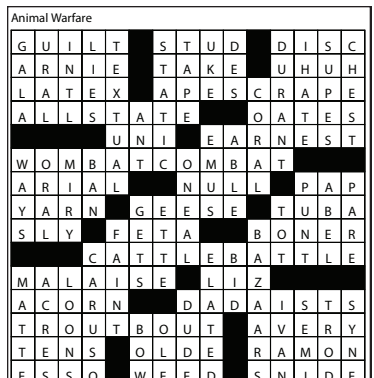
