## County 4-H'ers earn Key award

Two 4-H members received the Kansas 4-H Key Award Sunday at the 4-H Awards Banquet.

Allison Grice and Jandy Dunn were honored with the unique Key Award. The award recognizes leadership, citizenship and service to 4-H programs and the community.

Recipients are selected through an application process, said Pamela Van Horn, coordinator of the state's 4-H awards program.

To be considered for the award, a 4-H member must be at least 16 years old, have been a 4-H member for four or more years, enrolled in the 4-H Leadership Project for four or more years and clearly have demonstrated leadership, citizenship and concern for others in the 4-H programs and in their community.

The award has been given annually since 1953.

Allison Grice has been a member of the Pleasant Hill 4-H Club for 12 years and in the leadership program for 7 years. She has a long list of accomplishments including delivering care packages to the Village residents during the holidays and making table favors for the Village, hospital and St. Francis Senior Center, made care packages to send to the troops, organized crafts at the daycare during the summer, assisted at the Food Pantry, was in charge of decorating the luminaries and setting them up for the Relay for Life, was in charge of the silent auction to help raise money for the "Dig Pink" volleyball game, helped with the Linda Elfers' benefit, helped raise money through a silent auction for Village residents after the fire, assisted Village residents in the gym after the fire, made denim

stocking to raise money for St. Jude's Research Center, made two quilts to be auctioned off for Relay of Life fundraiser, made 150 stockings and filled them with candy for soldiers, helped with the annual Craft Show, and assisted Ward Cassidy, state representative, with his campaign-designed business cards, magnets and signs.

In 4-H, she has been the president of the council for 3 years, junior leader president, 2 years, Kansas State Photo Auction Team member including assisting with the state fair photography and 4-H photography camp at Rock Springs. She was the 2010 State Kansas Award Portfolio winner for family studies, and the 2011 photo selected at the state fair for display at K-State President's office for 1 year and, with the 4-H Iowa Camera Corps, had two photos selected to be on display at the photo exhibit in Iowa. These photos are also in the Pioneer Seed Calendar for 2012.

Allison is the daughter of Tammy Grice and the late Gary Grice.

### Jandy Dunn

Jandy has been a member of the Pleasant Hill 4-H Club for 10 years and participated in the leadership program for the required number of years.

Her work in community service has included helping with a fund raiser for the St. Francis Senior Center by collecting sales receipts from the local grocery store to give to the center. After collecting \$100,000 in receipts, the center receives \$1,000. She collected over \$30,000 in receipts.

In 2008, she donated 13-inches of her hair to the Relay for Life event. She also convinced a friend to donate her hair. The hair will be made into wigs for cancer patients. Jandy said she lost her grandmother to cancer and wants to help find a cure. She also bought luminaries in her grandmother's name and "walked for the cure."

Leadership found her working

with Lucas Carmichael, Brody Kaup, Trista and Ashley Orth and Casey Keller, helping them develop 4-H life skills.

She also helped with the 4-H window display which encouraged kids to join 4-H.

In 2009, the club purchased Christmas gifts for the Angel Tree. They wrapped and delivered the gifts to the bank where they were distributed to help children have a better Christmas.

She has held the offices of club treasurer, 4-H Council representative, reporter and secretary.

Jandy served as a junior sheep and beef superintendent at the county fair which included numerous duties and responsibilities.

Projects completed included arts and crafts, buymanship, archery, horse, sheep, photography and beef. At the county fairs, she had the grand champion and reserve champion market lambs and horses. She also had the grand champion market lamb at the Tri-State Royal and grand champion market lamb and senior sheep showmanship at the Multicounty show.

She participated in the Favorite Food Show, livestock judging contests and horse judging camp. She helped to acquaint others with 4-H work by reporting on KLOE Radio, wrote newspaper articles for the club meetings and gave project talks at school.

She attended Regional 4-H Days, Citizens in Action Discovery Days, and the Kansas State Fair.

Jandy is the daughter of Jim and Jeanne Dunn, St. Francis.

The goal of the Key Award is to encourage young people to explore opportunities for community service and to begin building leadership skills as they contribute to their community, Ms. Van Horn said. These opportunities can lay a foundation for a lifetime commitment of citizenship and service to build and improve home communities and the larger world.
