## Man promoted to rank of colonel

During a ceremony on Aug. 22 at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, Lt. Col. William A. Krueger was promoted to the rank of colonel in the Washington Air National Guard.

Col. Krueger serves as the Western Air Defense Sector (WADS) director of operations, supervising 205 U.S. and Canadian military and federal civilian personnel. The mission of the Western Sector is to provide air defense and air security for the western 72 percent of the Continental United States west of the Mississippi River, provide defense support to civil authorities, and provide direct assistance to the Customs and Border Patrol Air Marine Operations Center's counter-drug mission.

Col. Krueger is a 22-year veteran of the U.S. Air Force and Washington Air National Guard. He is a Command Air Battle Man-

ager with eight years of Air Force active duty service in deployed Ground Theater Air Control Systems, the Alaskan NORAD Region Operational Control Center, and NATO Airborne Warning and Control System (AWACS). Geilenkirchen Air Base, Germany.

Col Krueger joined the Washington Air National Guard in 1998 as a member of the Western Air Defense Sector where he was assigned as an air weapons officer and senior director. Over the years he worked his way up through various leadership positions to include mission crew commander, flight commander, and assistant chief of sector combat operations.

In May 2007, Lt. Col. Krueger was hand-picked as the 194th intelligence squadron conversion officer. He successfully executed the Washington State initiative to create a new squadron focused on intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance at Camp Murray, Wash. This monumental task involved the ground-up planning for the \$1.2 million secure infrastructure facility as well as recruiting and hiring the core leadership team. In January 2008, Lt. Col. Krueger returned to the Western Air Defense Sector as director of staff and later the assistant director of operations. He served as the interim director of
