

The chapter is unique as through the members' work in selling fruit and cheese at Christmas time and selling concessions at sporting events throughout the entire school year, they make enough money to pay for trips and fees.



Mr. Wiley said Cheyenne County/St. Francis kids have represented the state of Kansas 22 times at national events.


Mr. Wiley said that many of his FFA kids have went on to the college level because of their experience in the high school chapter.

There are nine junior colleges, Mr. Wiley said, calling me each year. Many of the kids receive full-ride scholarships.


The spring judging season is just beginning. The Herald will try to have results as the events happen.
