A website has been dedicated to the St. Francis High School alumni and faculty and is now online.

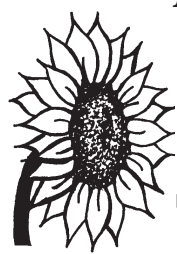
