Reid Raile, Cheyenne County Hospital information technologist, Murray, emergency management director, Jennifer Padgett, county communication director, and Mark Mills, emergency medical technician, talked to the board about the plans which needed to be made.

Mr. Raile said that after studying the issue, they felt like the best way to keep the county covered was to keep UHF and add 800 megahertz capabilities.

The wireless communication is changing quickly and there will be more changes in the future. The best way, said Dale Patton, commissioner is to go to a hybrid system, using both UHF pagers and the 800 megahertz radios. Mr. Raile said that firemen didn't want to carry a radio but preferred the smaller pager.


