 Demolition at the Idalia school will begin this week. The work will continue throughout July.

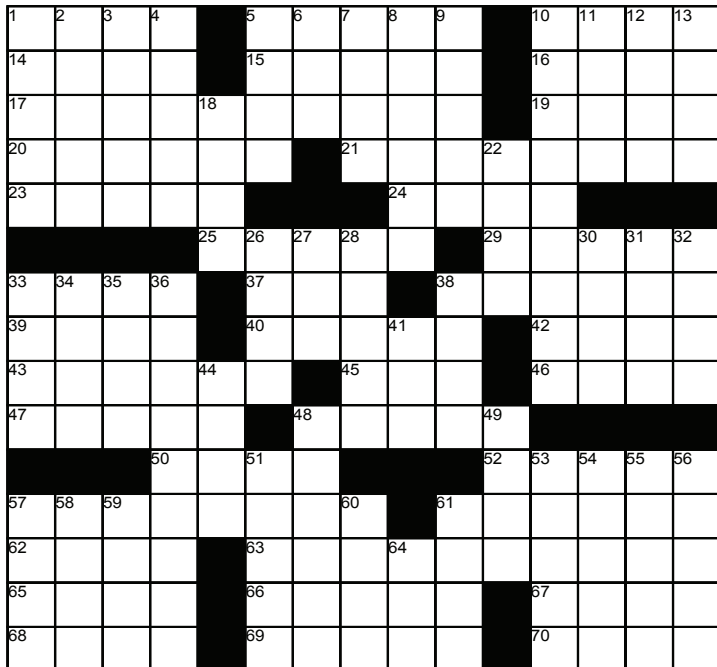


DAVE ROBBINS dumps a load of wheat at the Haigler Elevator from the Gilbert Oschner's farm from south of Haigler.
