

Four junior golfers travel to Atwood for tournament

Four golfers from St. Francis traveled to Atwood to play in the Northwest Kansas Junior Golf Regional tournament. To be eligible for regional play, the junior golfers had to have placed in the top three in the St. Francis, Hoxie, Oberlin, Goodland, Colby and Oakley tournaments held throughout the summer. There were 56 golfers in the tournament held on Monday, July 16 at the Atwood Country Club. The golfers from the St. Francis golf team were: Jesse Baxter, Brady Dinkel, Karly Bandel and Kyla Bandel.

Brady Dinkel and Jesse Baxter competed in the 8-9 year old boys division both scoring a 45,

tying for fourth place in regional play. Parker Krob from Plainville scored a 32; Ty Sides from Phillipsburg scored a 39 along with Jason Kranuawitter from Colby to tie for second and third place. Both Brady and Jesse played extremely good golf this season - their chip shots were great and their putting was top notch according to golf coach George Banister. This was Jesse's first year playing and he is a natural at golf. This was Brady's second year golfing and he has been consistently well all summer long.

Karly Bandel participated in the 10-11 year old girls division bringing home the third place trophy from regionals. Karly has been stroking the ball very well

and she is great with her chip shots, according to Coach Banister. Elle McDaniel placed first with a 48 and Bram Perryman placed second with a 51, both of Goodland. Karly scored a 61 for third place; Grace Greene scored a 63 for fourth place and she is from Goodland; Jersey Carney from Colby placed fifth with an 83 score. Coach Banister said that Karly has been doing a great job of working on her golf swing this summer and it has paid off since she has placed in the top three in each of her tournaments this summer.

Kyla Bandel golfed in the 14-15 year old division, golfing 18 holes. Kyla placed first in her division with a score of 89. Second place was Megan Siruta of Goodland with a 96 and third place was Emily Purvis of Goodland with a 96. Both girls participated in a playoff with Siruta breaking the tie, winning the playoff hole. Fourth place went to Logan Perryman of Goodland and fifth to Katie Smith of Goodland.

Coach Banister said that Kyla has executed great golf with her powerful strokes and consistent chipping and putting. Kyla has been fun to watch on the golf course showing how knowledgeable she is about the game.

Regional play was the last tournament of the summer for the junior golfers.

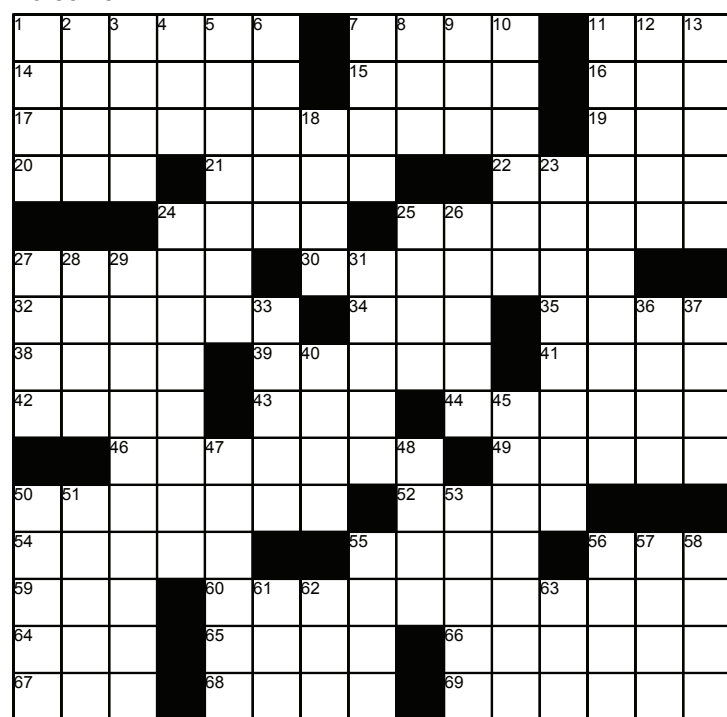
