**Student News**

Three students with connections to Cheyenne County are among more than 4,200 undergraduate students at the University of Kansas earning honor roll distinction for the spring 2012 semester. The students, from KU's Lawrence campus and the schools of allied health and nursing in Kansas City, represent 92 of 105 Kansas counties, 42 other states

and the District of Columbia, and 31 other countries.

The honor roll comprises undergraduates who meet requirements in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and in the schools of allied health; architecture, design and planning; business; education; engineering; journalism; music; nursing; pharmacy; and social welfare.

Listed to the honor roll are:

Taylor Leibbrandt, formerly of St. Francis and a graduate of Cheylin High School is a senior in French. He was named to the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences Spring Honor Roll.

Sara Miller of St. Francis is a graduate of St Francis Community High School and is a senior in strategic communications. She was named to the School of Journalism 2012 Spring Honor Roll.

Skyler Rueb of Frisco. is a graduate of Justin Wakeland High School and is a senior in applied behavioral science. She was named to the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences 2012 Spring Honor Roll.

Honor roll criteria vary among the university's academic units. Some schools honor the top 10 percent of students enrolled, some establish a minimum grade-point average, and others raise the minimum grade point average for each year students are in school. Students must complete a minimum number of credit hours to be considered for the honor roll.
