Northwest Kansas Family Shelter

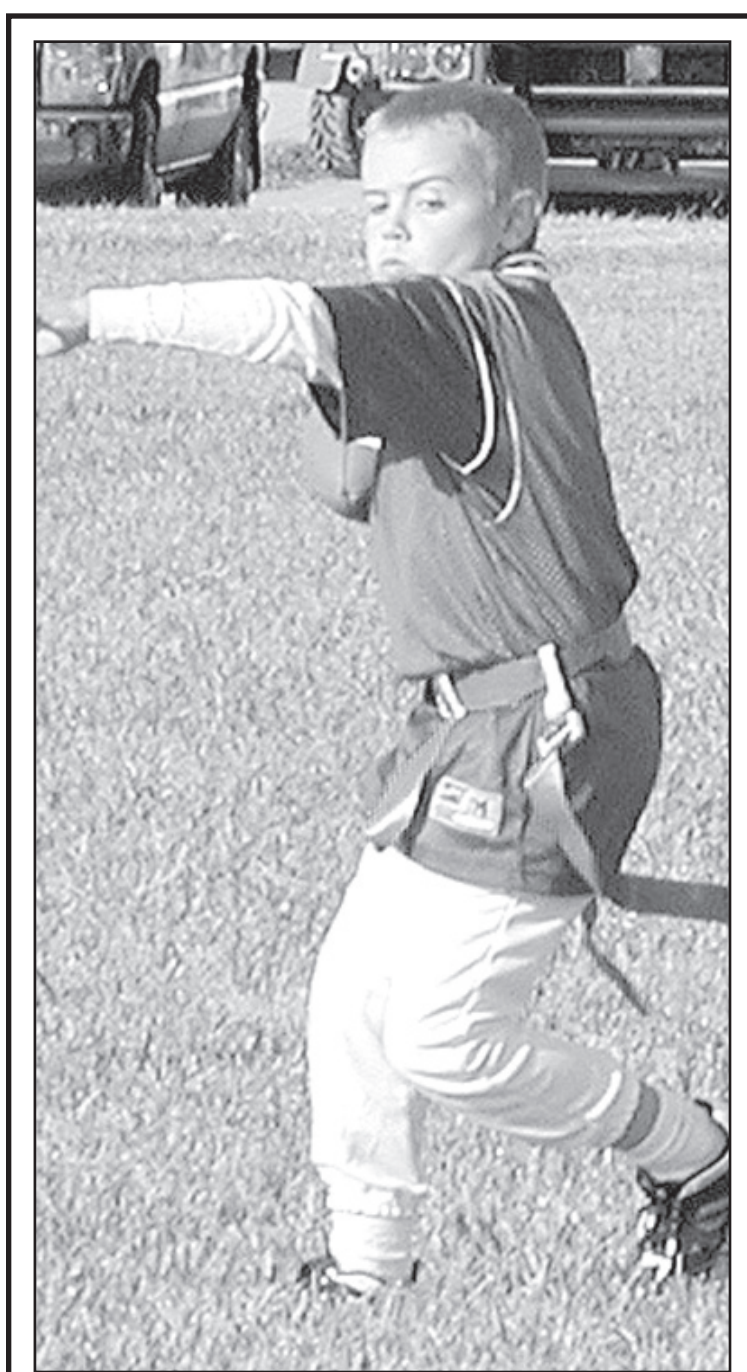
