The Ellis County Housing Authority (ECHA) has reopened the Section 8 Waiting List effective October 15, 2012. ECHA covers eighteen (18) counties Cheyenne, Decatur, Ellis, Gove, Graham, Logan, Norton, Osborne, Phillips, Rawlins, Rooks, Russell, Sheridan, Sherman, Smith, Thomas, Trego, and Wallace in Northwest Kansas. Ellis County Housing Authority is an equal housing opportunity program. The Housing Choice Voucher Program is a HUD Program with the goal of assisting low-income families, the elderly and the disabled, to afford decent, safe, and sanitary housing in the private market. All units must meet minimum standards of health and safety, as determined by the Housing Quality Standards regulations. Waiting list applicants must meet low-to-moderate income limits for their county, pass a background check, and have at least one preference to apply. Preferences include: victims of domestic violence; single persons who are elderly age 62 and over, families with any member working, receiving social security, or SSI; families paying more than $50 \%$ of their gross monthly income for rent and utilitie families who live or work in our 18 County region. Please submit a written request to The Ellis County Housing Authority, P.O. Box 248 Hill City Kansas 67642 to obtain a Waiting List Application. We ar asking for a written request to keep phone calls to a minimum, thanks. ECHA does not deny any family or individual the opportunity to apply for, or receive, assistance under the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program due to race, color, religion, creed, national or ethnic origin, age, family or marital status, handicap or disability.
