With the most current products and equipment they are ready to give their customers top trends and treatments and a full line of Biomega, and Aguage products



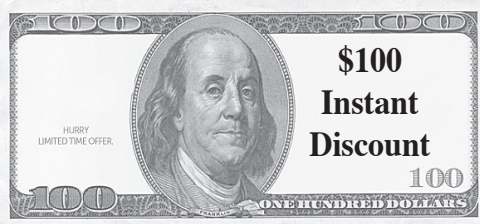

for women; Crew and Nioxin for men; and current items and trends in nail products. They are open from 10 a.m. - 5 p.m.

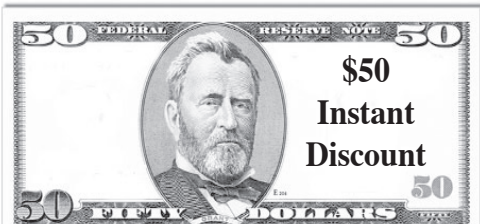
