Triplains-Brewster girls defeat Lady Indians

The St. Francis Lady Indians lost both contests played against Triplains-Brewster on Saturday evening, Feb. 2, in St. Francis. The Lady Indians lost the varsity contest 51-67. The junior varsity lost 17-

St. Francis got off to a good start in the varsity contest. Good ball movement and offensive patience resulted in several sharp possessions for the Lady Indians. Clarice Neitzel scored the first Lady Indian basket as a result of crisp ball movement.

A good pass from Laura Brunk, which set up a basket by Kyla Bandel, moved the score to 4-5. A long trey by Bandel (assist Neitzel) put the Lady Indians ahead 7-5. At 3:15, a trey by Justice Wiley moved the score to 10-5.

Wiley followed with a deuce, and Bandel nailed another threeball to give the Lady Indians a 15-7 advantage with 1:13 left in the period. Another trey by Bandel, her third of the period, moved the Lady Indians to a double digit lead, 18-7, with 49 seconds left in the first period. St. Francis led 18-12 after one period of play.

The next two quarters would not be so kind to the Lady Indians. Triplains-Brewster scored the first three baskets of the second quarter, tying the game (18-18), at 6:03, with an uncontested basket on an outof-bounds play. At 5:34, the Lady Titans took the lead and would not relinquish it again.



The St. Francis Indians had an "off night" against a good Dighton team on Friday, Jan. 25. The Indians seemed somewhat sluggish from the outset and were clobbered by a good Hornet team in Dighton. The Indians were aggressive early in the contest, and led 4-1 after Cade Bracelin scored on an assist from Kyler Zweygardt, and Wyatt Landenberger completed a nice driving layup in traffic. But then the turnovers began.

A tall, quick, aggressive Hornet team applied excellent pressure using a variety of defenses. The Hornets mixed in man-to-man, 1-3-1, and a smothering 2-2-1 press to give the Indians trouble. The Indians made several consecutive turnovers, and fell behind 4-10 about five minutes into the game. The Indians could only muster one more score in the first quarter, a basket by Dylan Peter (assist Wyatt Landenberger) resulting from the press offense. The Indians trailed 6-14 after one period.

In the battle of the Indians, St. Francis fell just short of defeating the home-standing Hoxie Indians on Friday night, Feb. 1. St. Francis lost to the state ranked (12-3) Hoxie team 50-56 in an exciting contest.

The Indians arrived "ready to play," earning defensive stops on the first two Hoxie possessions. Mason Schiltz went coast-to-coast for the first Indian basket. Dyan Peter followed with a trey, and the Indians were up early, 5-0.

A trey by Schiltz, on a Joey McCormick assist, moved the scoreboard to 25-21 at the 2:35 mark. At 1:24, Hoxie retook the lead 25-26. Kade Spresser drained a trey at the buzzer to give Hoxie a 25-29 lead at halftime.

> Schiltz added two free throws, and the Indians fouled Hoxie with 28 ticks remaining. Hoxie missed the free throws, but the Indians also missed their next shot attempt.

> The Indians fouled again at 14 seconds. This time, Hoxie converted both throws (50-56). The Hoxie defensive pressure caused the Indians to use a time out to get the ball thrown inbounds.

> After the time out, the Indians committed a turnover to seal the Hoxie win. The Indians had played hard, and well, but lost to a good Hoxie team, 50-56.

> Both teams shot extremely well from the free throw line. St. Francis converted 12 of 14 free throws while Hoxie was 11 of 13.

> Kade Spresser (6'1" junior) led all scorers with 28 points. Chase Kennedy and Tyler Ewers added 10 and 8 respectively to the Hoxie point total. St. Francis received 18 from Mason Schiltz, 13 from Cade Bracelin, and 11 from Dylan Peter in the contest. The Indians shot 50 percent from the field, but committed 23 turnovers. Dylan Peter grabbed eigh rebounds, and Steven Nelson had six.
