Health insurance discussed at meeting

The regular meeting of the St. Francis City Council met on Monday, Feb. 11.

Charles Krull representing Blue Cross Blue Shield, the city's health insurance, reported that the cost of city's health insurance benefits did not increase significantly. In fact, the insurance costs for single coverage went down, and insurance for family's only increased by 1 percent.

Next year will be totally different, Mr. Krull said, because next year there will be the new Affordable Health Care Act and that everyone's insurance will be changing.

Sue Griffin with the Cheyenne Center for Creativity introduced herself and wanted to inform council of the events that the center has planned. She also requested a council member to serve as a liaison between the center and the city council. After a few minutes of discussion, Paula Keller volunteered to serve as the liaison since Mrs. Keller is already involved with the theater board.

"The Cheyenne County for Creativity board is looking forward to new and exciting exhibits and art days coming soon," Mrs. Griffin said, adding that they have received tremendous support from the community.

A small business incentive was granted for Heritage Lumber (formerly known as Cheyenne Lumber) which gives the lumberyard a small reduction on their utility bill.

In the city superintendent report, J. R. Landenberger reported that the new signs for U.S. 36 showing directions to the high school and the airport will be mounted as soon as the airport sign comes in. Mr. Landenberger said he met with Bruce Webb the county tax assessor and the county commissioners asking for a reduction on the taxes on the property on Emerson Street. The city has possession of the property. The taxes were over \$1,800. Since the city wanted to clear the property the taxes were reduced to a one-time tax of \$350.

The new handrails for Main Street will be made from stainless steel because of the low maintenance cost.

The council also wanted people to know that the electricity rates had not gone up even though they had heard the grumbling of higher bills this month.

Council member Bruce Swihart reported they are still seeking applicants for pool lifeguards and water safety instructor. Mr. Swihart will remain on the airport committee.

Chief of Police Shane Guggemos gave the report for January. The St. Francis Police responded to two traffic accidents, issues 10 warnings, had one domestic issue call, six medical assists, four funeral details, three dog at large and nine civilian assists.

The next city council meeting will be at 7:30 p.m. on Monday Feb. 25, at city hall on Main Street.
