eral areas where he would like direction from the commissioners including physical therapy and certified nurse aides.

Dale Patton, commissioner, said he had received phone calls from some people who were wanting to put a family member in the nursing home. The nursing home can keep up to 35 patients and, at the time, there were only 30 beds full.

"I know you had staffing issues," Mr. Patton said to Mr. Paulsen.

We could not take any more residents because we are short of certified nurse aides, Mr. Paulsen said. Our first concern is for the care and safety of the residents.

Mr. Paulsen went on to say that they had advertised for aides and they are even offering to train peo-

ple so they are certified. We are paying well over minimum wage for a certified nurse aide.

Mr. Paulsen said he had given a presentation to high school students encouraging them to look at the different jobs offered at the nursing home. There are opportunities for keeping people in the county, he said.

Physical therapy

Mr. Paulsen said the nursing home and home health had been contracting with an outside therapy company for physical therapists. Not only would he like to be working with the hospital's physical therapy staff but he felt that it would be less expensive. It would benefit both the hospital and the nursing home if we could work together, he said.

It would be a win-win situation, Mr. Patton said. The hospital wants revenue and the Village wants to reduce the expense.

Mr. Paulsen said he had talked to the hospital administrator and they seemed to be on board. He noted that the hospital offers only physical therapy. They would still need to go outside the hospital for occupational and speech therapy.

Mr. Patton said he would talk to Judy Rockwood, hospital administrator, to see what could be worked out. Karan Thadani, county attorney, offered to help wherever he was needed.

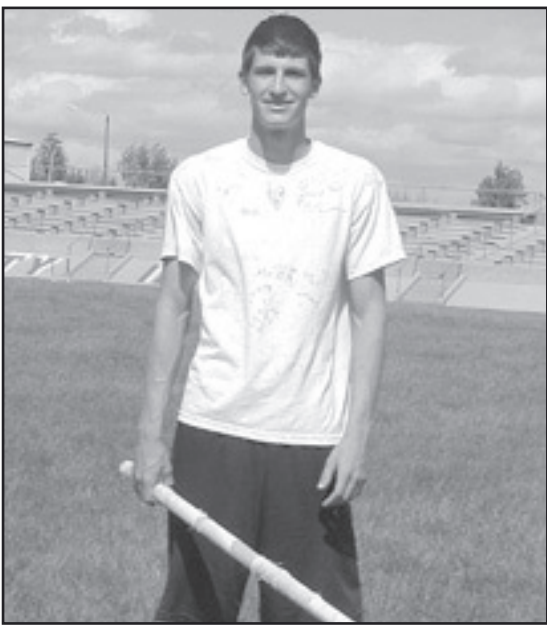
