Board accepts bid on metal covering

Board met at the fairgrounds on Thursday evening for a special meeting concerning the metal roof covering over the show arena south of the livestock barn. At the end of the meeting, the board agreed to accept the bid of Krien Steel Buildings.

President Dick Bursch had three bids for a structure 60 by 110 feet. Bids were: Majestic Service, St. Francis, \$42,715 but didn't include the concrete which was an additional \$10,236, pushing the the board account. would pay the Equity back in 10 years with 1-percent interest. With The Cheyenne County Fair Krien's low bid, the board would need to come up with \$1,429 for the 60 by 110 foot building.

The board then discussed adding the extra length to the building, \$3,200, and adding guttering to the east side of the roof which was one-half the \$1,400 or \$750. The total cost of the structure would be \$50.379.

The board voted to accept Krien's bid of \$50,379. The additional money, \$5,379, over the \$45,000 loan, will be taken out of

It was noted that an electrical pole on the south side of the livestock building will need to be removed . There is also a tree to remove which will be in the way of the building on the south side of the arena.
