Alila Mae (Kemp) Carpenter was born Sept. 11, 1916, and died on July 5, 2013, at the age of 96 years, 9 months, and 24 days.

Alila was the second of four daughters born to James Leroy Kemp and Lucy Marie Allen. She was raised on a farm southwest of Bird City and went to the Glendale school until third grade. In her third grade year, the family moved into town and she completed her school years in the Bird City school system. During her grade school years she learned quickly and was able to skip a year of school, thus graduating high school at the tender age of 16.

She was affectionately known as "Jackie" by her family and close friends, obtaining this nickname started by her dad's hired man because she was such a tom-boy and followed her father around.

Alila worked at her father's grain elevator until after she was married, breaking up her living in Bird City with short term jobs in Enid, Okla., where she was a "chicken plucker" for one day and decided that was not for her. Later she moved to Leadville, Colo., with her dear friend LaVenna Vanderpool- Martindale to work in a department store, always returning to her family and hometown.

She first met Murlin Gladwin Carpenter at a fellowship gathering at the Assembly of God Church in Traer, where her Uncle Harold Allen was pastor.
