## Commodities distribution

Cheyenne County commodity distribution of government surplus will be from 5 to 5:30 p.m., on Monday, Aug. 19, at the Church of Christ, 502 W. Spencer in St. Francis.

The types of food vary and include vegetables, fruits, juices, meat, cereals, peanut butter, non-fat dried milk and pastas.

The food is shipped to the Church of Christ and it is supplied four or more times per year.

To be eligible for commodities, the household's total monthly income must be below:

- \$1,245 - household of one;
  - \$1,681 - household of two;
  - \$2,116 - household of three;
  - \$2,552 - household of four.
- For each additional family member, add \$436.

Those ordering must pick up their order in person or send a signed official proxy form with another individual. Proxy forms are available at the senior center in St. Francis. An accurate and complete Cheyenne County address is required.

## Food Pantry

If your family is struggling to make ends meet, and you are a resident of Cheyenne County

you are eligible to pick up a box of food from the food pantry once per month. Distributions are made on the third Saturday of each month from 9 - 11 am at the west entrance of the county courthouse in St. Francis. cancer treatments.

Although he only intended to attend to watch the shearing, Grandpa Dale as well as Alec's other grandpa, Joe Balusek, volunteered to shave their heads as well. While there wasn't nearly as much to shave, both grandfathers bravely sat side by side and

left their locks on the floor along with those of their grandson's.

Dale, a resident from St. Francis, noted that every three minutes, a child is diagnosed with cancer. Of all funds raised for cancer research, less than 4 percent goes to finding a cure for childhood cancer.
