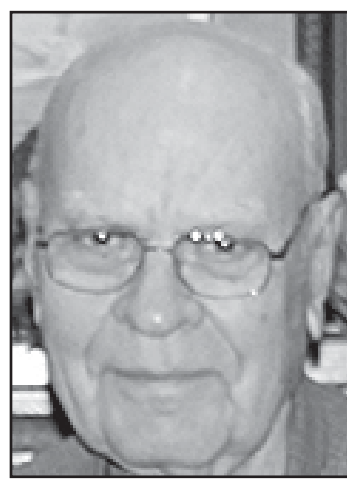


Man to celebrate 90th birthday
