**Influenza Season Facts** Flu seasons are unpredictable in a their nose. number of ways. Although epidemics of flu happen every year, the timing, severity, and length of the season varies from one year to another. vaccine: 1) inactivated vaccine

Flu viruses are constantly changing so it's not unusual for new flu virus strains to appear each year. This year's flu vaccine is designed to protect against the influenza vimost common during the upcoming season.

Three kinds of influenza viruses commonly circulate among people today: Influenza A (H1N1) viruses, influenza A (H3N2) viruses, and in- cause the flu. The nasal spray is for fluenza B viruses. The flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat, and medical provider. They include lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. The best way to prevent the flu is by getting a flu vaccine each year.

Signs and symptoms of the flu include; fever or feeling feverish/ of age. The single best way to prevent the flu is to get a flu vaccine each season. There are two types of flu (containing killed virus) that are given with a needle.
