The Society, founded by the Rev. August "Dad" Hoeger, was incorporated on Sept. 29, 1922, and opened its first home, a six-room rented house, on March 1, 1923, in Arthur, N.D. Over the years, the Society has grown from serving a handful of residents to being the nation's largest not-for-profit provider of care and services for seniors and others in need.

The Good Samaritan Society of Cheyenne County plans a salad and dessert potluck dinner on Sunday, Oct. 6, at noon to commemorate Founder's Day. The Village will supply beef barbecue and potatoes as well as beverages, while guests are asked to bring
