Youth take part in shotgun shootout

The 4-H state shotgun shoot was held Saturday at Ark Valley Gun Club in Valley Center. 4-H'ers Brice Hays, Bradey Hansen and Dallas Reed, from Cheyenne County, participated.

Winds from the north made shooting difficult, said Rodney Radcliff, instructor.

Brice placed 16th overall in the junior division, with a combined total of 69 out of 100. He also placed seventh on the 16 yard, with a total of 40 out of 50, and 23rd on the 20 yard with a total of 29 out of 50.

Dallas was 12th overall in the senior division, with a combined total of 80 out of 100. She was 23rd in trap off of the 16 yard line, with 43 out of 50, and eighth in skeet with 37 out of 50.

Bradey placed 29th overall in the senior division, with a combined total of 73 out of 100. He was eighth in trap off of the 16 yard line with 46 of 50, and 53rd in skeet with 27 of 50.

This is the first year that the senior division was required to shoot skeet. The kids were traveling to Trenton, Neb., to practice.

Bradey and Dallas were on the first squad in skeet, Mr. Radcliff said. Brice was also on the first squad in trap. The winds were a definite factor when Brice shot his handicap at the 20-yard line.

The Cheyenne County Wildlife organization supports the kids each year with travel expenses, clays, and use of the gun club facilities for practice.

Local man found dead

On Sept. 24, at 8 p.m., officers from the Cheyenne County Sheriff's department found Bill Gray in his vehicle near River and Emerson streets. The ambulance was called to the scene. Emergency medical technicians responded, and transported Mr. Gray to the hospital, where he was pronounced dead.

An investigation was completed by the sheriff's department. There were no signs of foul play, and it was ruled that the death was not suspicious.

Sheriff Cody Beeson said that the community is not in any danger, and most importantly, that "our hearts go out to the family involved."

USDA Commodity Distribution

Cheyenne County commodity distribution of government surplus will be from 5 to 5:30 p.m., on Monday, Oct. 21, at the Church of Christ, 502 W. Spencer in St. Francis.

The types of food vary and include vegetables, fruits, juices, meat, cereals, peanut butter, nonfat dried milk and pastas. The food is shipped to the Church of Christ and it is supplied four or more times per year.

To be eligible for commodities, the household's total monthly income must be below:
 \$1,245 - household of one;
 \$1,681 - household of two;
 \$2,116 - household of three;
 \$2,552 - household of four. For each additional family member, add \$436.

Those ordering must pick up their order in person or send a signed official proxy form with another individual. Proxy forms are available at the senior center

in St. Francis. An accurate and complete Cheyenne County address is required.
