



Malaria is caused by a parasite the deaths are among children under the age of five. Hope Waya was a bright-eyed tenmonth old living in Nigeria. She contracted the disease and died July 10. Hope's grandfather died in 1996, and her Aunt Esther died in 2001 at age 11. Malaria symptoms appear 7-15 days after the mosquito bite. The first symptoms include fever, headache, chills, and vomiting. If not treated within 24 hours of the symptoms, malaria can quickly bring on death.

Malaria is preventable and curable. Increased malaria prevention and control measures are dramatically reducing the malaria burden in many places. Since 2000, malaria mortality rates have fallen by more than 25 percent. "Nothing But Nets" is a joint effort by the NBA, the UMC, and others to raise money to provide mosquito nets for beds. "Imagine No Malaria" is taking this a step further by raising money to purchase nets, provide education, medication, open hospitals and clinics, promote research for a licensed vaccine, and implementing mosqui-

to control programs. As of Oct. 1, the people of the United Methodist Church have raised nearly \$54 million by putting their faith into action.
