Glenn was born Aug. 3, 1924. to John and Fern Glasco at their farm home south of Bird City, Kan. He was one of nine children, five boys and four girls, of which two died at infancy.

During Glenn's youth he attended Center Country School and Center Church south of Bird City. He was baptized in the Beaver Creek as a boy and later attended Bird City Rural High School.

Growing up on the farm was always full of adventure and hard work. Glenn helped his dad, John, farm and always dreamed of being a cowboy someday. While selling cattle at the Benkelman Sales Company in Benkelman, Neb., he met the love of his life, Mildred Jean Jones, who worked at the sale barn.

II had broke out in Europe and every young man was wondering what the future would hold. On Dec. 7, 1941, Japan attacked Pearl Harbor and the United States shortly thereafter entered World War II. Glenn volunteered and enlisted in the United States Army in December of 1944. He was inducted at Fort Logan in Colorado and took his training at Camp Roberts in California.

Glenn and Millie decided to get married before he was to be shipped out overseas, so they married April 15, 1945, in Benkelman, and right away Glenn shipped out for the Pacific Theater of War. As he sailed under the Golden Gate Bridge and watched it disap-


