

League dual win goes to Hoxie

"They were a very tough team," Coach Larry Gabel said concerning the Saintry dual 52-18 loss to Northwest Kansas League opponent Hoxie Friday night. "Hoxie is ranked Number One in 3-2-1A.

"I felt like for the most part we wrestled up to our potential, but there are always the exceptions to that rule.

Hoxie controlled the lower weights with Saintry gaining its first win at 152 pounds when Ty Long scored a 9-4 victory. Later Jeremiah Wiley pinned his opponent, Ben Swihart won by decision and Travis Hilt ended the evening with a fall. Long, Wiley and Swihart are all seniors while Hilt is a junior.

Saintry had three open weights which added 18 points to the Hoxie total.

"We can continue training and gain experience and will be much better by the time regionals and state rolls around," said coach Gabel.

The Indians will be at home against Oakley Friday night and then participate in the Sterling Invitational on Saturday. The second half of the season is definitely in full swing.





Indians play well; earn league victory

St. Francis scored their second win of the season Friday night when they defeated Northwest Kansas League opponent Hoxie 77-59. Saintry limited the Hoxie offensive production in the fourth quarter to have an especially good quarter, scoring 27 points to 11 for Hoxie. At the end of three Saintry had a small 50-48 lead.

"This is a big win," Coach Greg Wolters said. "We really needed a 'W' after going 1-6 before the break.

"Hoxie is ranked in the top five in 2A so we knew it would take a great effort just to compete with them.

"The final score is not indicative of how close the game really was. It was a three point game with 4:30 to go. We did a great job of making plays down the stretch. We made some big shots, got stops defensively and made our free throws to get the win.

This win was truly a team effort. Everyone contributed and played hard. All five starters were in double figures scoring - that kind of balance made defending us very difficult. We rebounded better than we have all year."

The starters and their double-digit scoring included Cale Rieger 17, Michael Raile 16, Dustin Dunn 14, Marcus Dodd 14 and Tyler Wolters 14. Saintry put nine free throws through

the hoop in the final quarter with Dunn collecting three, Wolters two and Dodd four. Dodd was also hot from the field during this time with four twos.

Rieger was instrumental in keeping the score close before the final quarter with eight points in the second and seven in the third. Raile had collected 14 of his points in the first three quarters also.

Dunn and Wolters with three each and Rieger with one added important three-pointers throughout the game.

Controlling rebounds is also an important aspect of the game and Saintry had 41 compared to 34 for Hoxie. Dunn led the way with 11.

Other offensive pluses for Saintry were Dunn's 10 assists and Dodd's three blocked shots.

"This win gives us some confidence and momentum going into the weekend (at Oakley Friday and against Holyoke at home)," coach Wolters said.

"We'll continue to work hard to get better."

Hoxie takes home 62-34 win

In Northwest Kansas League basketball action Friday night, St. Francis entertained Hoxie with the visi-

tors taking home the 62-34 victory. This gives the Saintry ladies a 4-4 overall record and a 0-2 league standing.

"They (Hoxie) are a very good

team," Coach Ted Busse said. "They ran the floor well."

Hoxie had a hot 58 percent from two-point range while St. Francis collected 26 percent.

"We both had about the same number of shooting attempts but we didn't make the shots," coach Busse said.

Saintry also lost opportunities at the free-throw line when they connected on only 4-of-16 attempts for another 25 percent. The good news was that Saintry did a very nice job of not committing fouls so Hoxie had only two chances at the line.

Both teams were a little rusty when it came to turnovers, possibly from having no games during the Christmas break. Saintry had 38 and Hoxie 37.

Saintry pretty much kept up with Hoxie in the first quarter (12-8) but by halftime they were behind 25-12.

The scoring in the first half was very diversified with five players, Sam Coates (a three pointer), Ashley Holzwarth, Kelsey Andrist, Allyse Lampe and Kandee Raile each having one field goal with Lampe also adding a free throw.

The scoring was an even 10-10 in the third quarter but then Hoxie turned up the heat in the fourth outscoring Saintry 27-12.

Coates led the scoring for Saintry with 11 points, while Andrist led the rebounding with seven.

Saintry will travel to Oakley on Friday night.


"That should be a good game," coach Busse said. The Indians meet Holyoke on Saturday evening at home with an early 5 p.m. game time.
