Winthrop is a school of about 6,000 students and is located in Rock Hill, which is in the northern central part of the state. 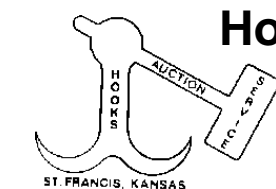
