ties to undergraduate students to study for up to one calendar year at another National Student Exchange member college or university.

Students participate in the program in order to broaden personal and educational perspectives, explore and appreciate new cultures, widen university boundaries, take courses not offered at home campus, learn from different professors, and access courses with a different perspective. Students also are able to explore new areas of study, experience personal growth, live in a different part of the country, look for future employment opportunities and become more independent and resourceful.

There are more than 70,000 students who have been placed in life-changing exchange situations which challenged their thinking, expanded their educational and personal experiences, and encouraged them to take risks and reap the rewards of doing so. Seven other Fort Hays State students will be participating in the National Student Exchange program and will be attending schools around the country.

Voeller will be representing Fort Hays State University at Winthrop University, S.C., for the 2002-03 academic year as a junior. Winthrop is a school of about 6,000 students and is located in Rock Hill, which is in the northern central part of the state. Voeller chose this school because of its impressive College of Business and because of its location.


