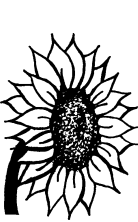

They played good defense and kept us in our offense most of the time. Raile also chipped in eight points. Trevor

Henderson had a spectacular night in both scoring and rebounding. He ended the game with 17 points. Overall, I was very pleased with our effort and performance.”

It was a good week for the Indian basketball team as they defeated Atwood 49-28 Tuesday in a contest which did not count in the league standings and Hoxie (64-61) Friday night in a Northwest Kansas League contest. The boys’ record now stands at 5-4.

**St. Francis 49, Atwood 28**

St. Francis had a better scoring percentage in every area Tuesday in their win over the Buffs. Sainty was 34 percent compared to 24 percent from two-point range, 66.7 percent to 7.7 percent from three-point range and 87.5 percent to 68.8 percent from the free-throw line

“This was a nice road win for us,” Coach Greg Wolters said. “We were solid defensively and held Atwood to only 28 points. Anytime you keep a team in the 20’s, you have to like your chances to win.”

Tyler Wolters led the scoring with 20 points and while Marcus Dodd pulled down 14.

“We did a nice job on the boards (39-28) and didn’t allow Atwood many second chances to score,” Coach Wolters said.

St. Francis had 10 steals, led by Wolters with 4.5, 11 assists with Jonathan Roelfs, Tyler Voorhies and Wolters each having three. Cale Rieger and Dodd each blocked a shot.

“Everyone contributed - it was a team effort,” Coach Wolters said. “We’re getting better and gaining confidence. Friday at Hoxie we will need a great effort. They are a quick, up-temp team that can score a lot of points.”

“This was an exciting high school

basketball game,” Coach Wolters said. “There were huge momentum swings in the first half and a last second shot to try to send the game to overtime in the second half. Fortunately, we were able to hold on for the win. Anytime you go on the road against a good team, get behind 14-0 and come back and win, you have to be thrilled.”

St. Francis shot 46.2 percent from the field including from three-point range where Wolters was 4-of-7 and Rieger 2-of-4. From the line, Sainty was 52.6 percent (10-of-19) with Roelfs having the best percentage with 2-of-3.

“Hoxie made six shots in a row to lead 14-0 about 2 minutes into the game,” Coach Wolters said. “The guys kept their composure, got some stops on the defensive end, made some shots and got back into the game. We trailed 20-10 at the quarter and led at halftime 35-34. We talked a lot about playing the game one possession at a time no matter the score and I think the kids did that. We played with confidence, passion and determination.

“We shot the ball well and won the rebounding battle (43-32). Everyone played a part in this win.”

Four players were in double figures with Wolters having 18 points, Dodd 11 points and Roelfs and Rieger, 10 each.

Leading the rebounding was Dodd with 18. He is among the area leaders in this category according to the Salina Journal. Having blocked shots were Dodd (3), Rieger (1) and M. Raile (1).

“The kids have been working hard and we’re improving, but we can’t afford to be satisfied with where we are. We have to get better,” Coach Wolters said.
