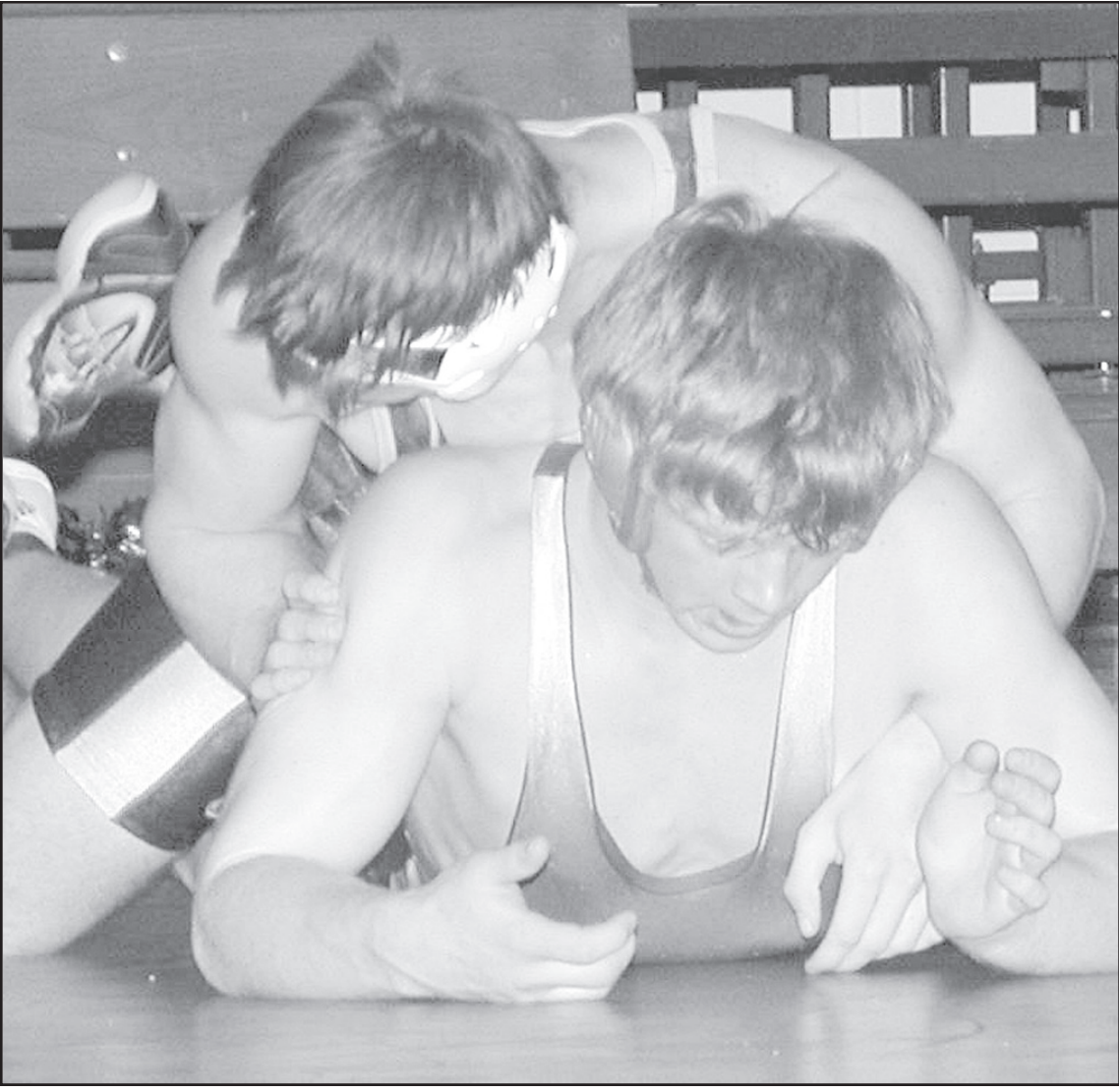

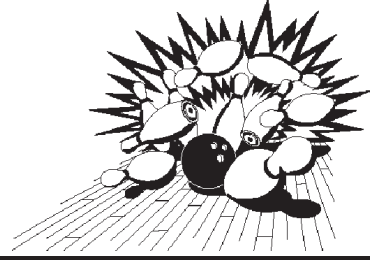

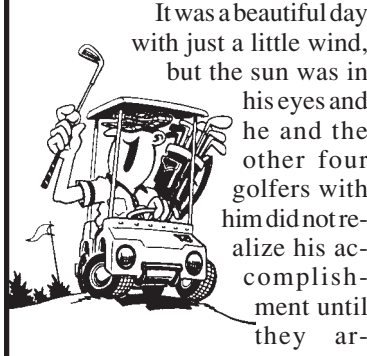

It was a beautiful day with just a little wind, but the sun was in his eyes and he and the other four golfers with him did not realize his accomplishment until they arrived on the green.

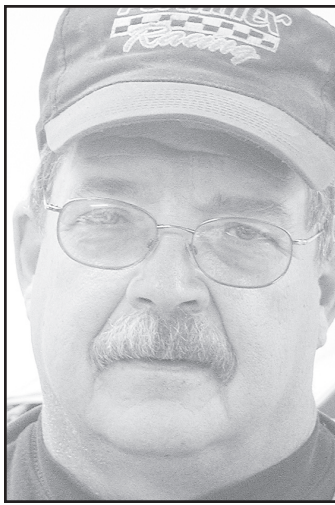
Golfing with him were Dale Crabtree, Roger Faulkender, Roger Lauer and Rich Grace.
