Boys place sixth in Oberlin Tournament

St. Francis placed sixth in the Oberlin Invitational basketball tournament after losing to Oakley in the opening game, defeating Resurrection Christian in the second game and falling to Hoxie on Saturday night.

Quinter and Oakley met in the championship game on Saturday night and Quinter prevailed as the winner.

Heath Owens of St. Francis was chosen to the All-Tournament Academic team.

The Indians will play at home on Friday night against the Brewster Bulldogs. The season is nearing the two-thirds point and this would be a good time to visit the high school gym for some basketball action.

Oakley 65, St. Francis 38

St. Francis and Oakley played in the first round of the tournament with Oakley moving on into the championship bracket and St. Francis the consolation round. The final score was Oakley 65, St. Francis 38

“Oakley is a good ball club and we got to play them twice in a row,” Coach Ward Cassidy said. “AJ McAtee was our defensive player of the game. He did a fantastic job on the league’s best point guard holding him to 10 points. The attitude award went to Levi Weeden. He got nine rebounds and played hard the whole game.”

The Indian scoring was a complete team effort with no player in the double-figure area. Seven players chipped in to total 38 points with Weeden, Tanner Kinen and Adam Peter all having seven points.

The Plainsmen had two especially strong quarters, the first and the third, with over 20 points falling through the basket in each of these periods.

“We only shot 26 percent for the game,” Coach Cassidy said. “I felt like the guys were being fouled without getting the call but to their credit they just continued to play. I have told them all season that there has never been a referee change a call so to just play hard and not worry about the officials.”

Besides AJ McAtee having 10 rebounds, Weeden was close behind with nine. The team had five blocked shots. Nick Raile and Joel McAtee had two each and AJ McAtee, one. The team battled back and were close in the rebounding department (Oakley 41, St. Francis 37).

“The word we use when we break the huddle is ‘respect.’” Coach Cassidy said. “Until we can compete better we won’t get too many breaks.”

St. Francis 53 Resurrection Christian 34

St. Francis came back in the second game of the tournament and scored a win over Resurrection Christian allowing the Indians to play for the consolation championship on Saturday. Sainty won Friday’s game by a score of 53-34.

“We had nine boys score in this game (see below),” Coach Ward Cassidy said. “Our bench really came in and did a good job. JD (Hawkins) and Mac (Frewen) are starting to get more confidence in their ball handling and are playing very good defense.”

In this game, Resurrection Christian was the team that started off slowly. Sainty scored 18 points in the fourth quarter for their best output.

Two players scored in double figures, Adam Peter had 11 and Levi Weeden 10.

The team was 50 percent from the field with 1-of-2 from three-point range and 17-of-34 from the two-point area. Hawkins had the best percentage with 3-of-4 for 75 percent.

The team was just over 50 percent from the free-throw line with a total of 31 shots attempted. Being 100 percent was M. Frewen with 2-of-2, Nick Raile and Peter were each 3-of-4 for 75 percent.

“The defensive player of the game was AJ McAtee. It seems like each game he is assigned a top scorer,” Coach Cassidy said. “He held a 20-plus scorer to only three points.”

“The attitude player award went to Levi Weeden. Levi was so sick I told his mom to take him home but he insisted on playing and had one of his best games.”

The Indians had four blocked shots with Raile having two, eight assists with AJ McAtee, Joel McAtee and Tanner Kinen each having two and 34 rebounds. Leading in rebounds were J. McAtee and Kinen with eight each.

Hoxie 85, St. Francis 49

“Even though the score doesn’t indicate it, we did a lot of good things in this game,” Coach Cassidy said. “Until we got in foul trouble

we were right with them.

“We scored well off of our press breaker and ran some very good offensive sets. Hoxie is just a very good team with great shooters. They had nine three-point goals in the game, which is more than we have made all season.”

Kinen led the scoring for the Indians with 12 points followed by J. McAtee with 11. The team was 51.3 percent from the field with Weeden being 2-of-2 for 100 percent.

“The defensive player of the game was Nick Raile with several blocked shots and five rebounds. The attitude players of the game were JD Hawkins and Mac Frewen. They both came off the bench and really played hard.”

Sainty and Hoxie tied in rebounds with 29 each. Ten Indians had at least one board with Raile and

J. McAtee each having five. Raile had three blocked shots and J. McAtee had four assists.

“The week ended on a great note and Gale and Mary Walz hosted the basketball squad Sunday morning on a pheasant hunt and a luncheon barbecue,” Coach Cassidy said. “The guys shot blue rock to warm up their shot guns and then shot several pheasants. You can cover a lot of ground with 15 hunters. The team and coaches had a wonderful time and greatly appreciated the day.”
