## Kansas women will be taught outdoor skills

Women from across Kansas will learn outdoor skills at the 12th annual Becoming an Outdoors Woman (BOW) workshop at Rock Springs 4-H Center, near Junction City on Sept. 24-26.

The event is sponsored by the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks for women who may never have experienced baiting a hook, cleaning a quail, building a campfire, or a myriad of other outdoor activities. Skills learned in the workshop will not only help women enjoy these activities, they will equip them to enjoy the outdoors with family and friends.

This workshop features a relaxed environment that is almost exclusively hands-on. Seminars help participants become familiar with equipment and techniques related

to dozens of different outdoor activities. Expert instructors guide participants, who may choose from more than 40 different activities, including hunting, fishing, wild game cooking, float tubing, archery, stream ecology, canoeing, natural history, backpacking, camping, and more.

The workshop, designed for women 18 years or older, there is a cost which includes six meals, two nights of lodging in a cabin (tent lodging also available), supplies, and use of equipment. Three \$100 scholarships are available, based on financial need, for first-time participants.

## Committee elections planned for December

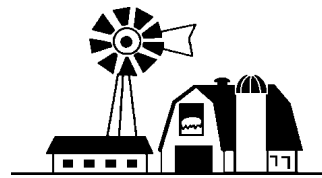
The Cheyenne County Farm Service Agency Committee election will be held this year on Dec. 12. Eligible voters have the right to nominate candidate(s) of their choice. Blank FSA-669A's may be obtained at the County Farm Service Agency office. Each FSA-669A submitted must be: limited to one nominee; signed by the nominee, indicating willingness to serve, if elected; and postmarked or delivered to the County Farm Service Agency Office no later than Dec. 5.

Persons nominated should be currently engaged in the operation of a farm or ranch and be well qualified for committee work. A farmer is eligible to be a County Farm Service Agency Committee member if the farmer lives in Local Administrative Area (AL) Number 3 (located in the northwest 2/3 of Cheyenne County) and is an eligible voter. County Farm Service Agency Committee members may not hold positions in certain farm and commodity organizations, if these positions pose a conflict of interest with Farm Service Agency duties. These positions include functional offices such as presi-

dent, vice president, secretary, and positions on boards or executive committees. Additional information on eligibility to hold office may be obtained at the Cheyenne County Farm Service Agency Office.

The duties of County Farm Service Agency Committee members include: informing farmers of the purpose and provisions of the Farm Service Agency programs; keeping the Kansas State Farm Service Agency Committee informed of Local Administrative Area (LAA) conditions; recommending needed changes in farm programs; participating in county meetings as necessary; and performing other duties as assigned by the State Farm Service Agency Committee.

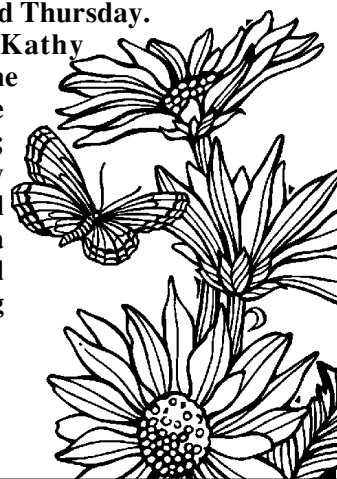
