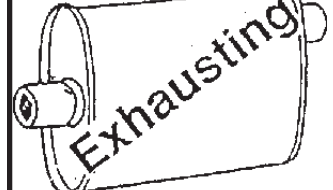

## Number available for road conditions

So often, people are wondering about road conditions whether it be weather conditions or detours. Now, the Kansas Department of Transportation is offering a number to call.

Fans traveling to football games this fall can help themselves arrive at stadiums safely and on time for kickoff by using the Kansas 511 travel information phone system and 511.ksdot.org.

By calling 511 from anywhere inside Kansas or 1-866-511-KDOT anywhere in the U.S., travelers can get automated, near real-time, route-specific road conditions, construction detours, and travel weather (both current and forecasted) information for Interstate, U.S., or state highways in Kansas and the Kansas Turnpike.

With updates every 15 minutes, Kansas 511 can be a resource to

help keep travelers informed. Information is provided all day, every day, and is free from a landline phone. For cellular users, the call will most likely count against their minutes, but no roaming fee should be charged.

With many road construction projects still in progress before winter, detours and road closures could be encountered by fall travelers. By calling 511 before traveling, callers can find out if planned routes are impacted by road work and can make alternative plans as needed.

Road condition information is entered by Kansas Department of Transportation crews across the state. Kansas 511 also provides similar information for Nebraska, which is the only surrounding state with an active 511 system. Currently, phone numbers are

provided for callers to access information in the surrounding states of Missouri, Oklahoma and Colorado.

Another way to obtain roadway construction/detour and weather-related road condition information is through Kansas Department of Transportation internet site. Travelers can access a map detailing existing road conditions across the state. The map is located at 511.ksdot.org and it can also be accessed through Department's main web site <http://www.ksdot.org> under "Road Conditions." CHECK IT OUT

Travelers may now also get helpful information about Kansas 511 by selecting the new "511 System Info" link at the top of the map. This link provides users with Frequently Asked Questions tips/

information for using 511, contact information for 511 help, general 511 information and links to weather information.

Nationally, 511 is available in 23 states with 26 active systems and more states are set up to deploy in the coming months. Some states have several regional 511 systems. As of June 2005, the 511 number has logged 36,397,785 calls since the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) designated 511 as the national travel information number in July 2000. Number 511 is currently available to 81 million Americans.

## Oberlin offers tour

The Oberlin Arts and Humanities Commission will sponsor a tour of sites along the Last Indian Raid on Kansas soil on Sunday, Sept. 25, with local historian Calvin Ufford as narrator and guide.

The group will visit sites southwest of Oberlin where the Northern Cheyenne Indians came through Decatur County on Sept. 28, 1878, killing 17 settlers.

A contemporary account reported, "All settlers were hopeful and happy in the thought of having a home of their own, with no thought of danger for them and theirs, when, like a bolt of lightning out of the clear sky, came the mas-

sacre of Sept. 30, 1878, by Dull Knife's band of Cheyennes."

The tour will help kick off Mini Sappa events sponsored by the museum the following week.

Those planning to attend are asked to meet at the Last Indian Raid Museum at 1:45 p.m. to load the bus. The group will return about 4 p.m. for refreshments.
