School District 103 requests annual county tax levy

Published in the Bird City Times, Bird City, Kansas, Thursdays, October 20 and October 27, 2005 (42-43). In *Wings of Fire*, Air Force General Patrick McClanahan, ostracized by the government, the military, even his own family, is near the end of his rope. And it's about to get worse. North Africa is in turmoil. The new Libyan president has had the new Egyptian president assassinated, and the latter's widow, Susan Salaam, vows revenge. Enlisting the high-tech help of McClanahan and his Night Stalkers, she survives
