Wrestling teams compete for trophy

The 45th annual St. Francis Invitational Wrestling Tournament held on Saturday opened the 2005-06 wrestling season for the Indians. The tournament ended with Colby earning the championship with 159.5 points. They had three champions, one second place finish and

Coming in second was Pine Creek with three champions, three second place finishes, and one third.

Placing third with 148 points was Goodland. The Cowboys had two champions, two second place finishes and two thirds.

This year the Indians placed fourth with 135.5 points, having one champion, five second place finishes, one third, two fourths, one sixth, and two seventh.

Taking the crown in his weight class was Brennan Wilger at 275 pounds. He defeated Doxon of Goodland in the championship

Also qualifying for championship matches were Trevor Richard, Gavin Smull, Dylan Loyd, Justin Sherlock and Jordan Gienger with each receiving second place honors. Gabe Smull took an injury de-


