Several St. Francis youth have been attending area kids wrestling tournaments recently.



The season is winding down with sub-district action taking place at Phillipsburg this week. District will be in Goodland the following weekend and then State.

- On Saturday, Feb. 25, six wrestlers attended a tournament in Imperial, Neb. Results include: 6-and-under: Luke Lampe, first; 8-and-under: Derek Vandike, fourth; 10-and-under: Logan Lampe, first; Casey Vandike, second; Lane Hoffman, second; Thomas Douthit, fourth.
- Shakotah Blanka went to the tournament in Scott City and placed first in the 8-and-under 130 pound division.
- Eight wrestlers from St. Francis went to hays for the Western Kansas Classic tournament held at Gross memorial Coliseum on Saturday, March 4. There were over 800 wrestlers in the tournament.

Three kids brought home first place, Shakotah Blanka at 125 pounds in 8-and-under; Trevor Reed at 130 pounds in 12-and-under and Adam Guthmiller, 150 pounds at 12-and-under. 10-and-under: Lane Hoffman and Chase Krien participated. 12-and-under: Casey Keller participated. 14-and-under: Darris Keller at 100 pounds placed second. 16-and-under: David Guthmiller at 185 pounds placed third.

Substate loss ends season for St. Francis

Quinter defeated St. Francis 74-49 in the final game of the season, round one of the Hoxie Substate. The loss moved Quinter into the semi-finals and the Indians out of the running for the 2A state title. When the final substate game was played on Saturday evening, Trego, one of the eight teams in the Hoxie Substate, won the right to advance to the State tournament. On Tuesday night, as had happened in February, the Bulldogs

used the long shot to their advantage, helping them to advance in the playoffs. "Quinter shot 76 percent from the three-point line making 13-of-17," Coach Ward Cassidy said. "Tyler Reed scored 37 points against us with nine three pointers, many of his shots we had a hand in his face and he still would knock it down." Sainty was only down seven points at half time but the third quarter proved to tell the story.

When Quinter scored 23 points and the Indians 10 the Bulldog lead grew to 20 points and the Indians could not put together a comeback. Joel McAtee scored 14 points for the Indians while AJ McAtee added 12. Joel was 1-of-1 from three-point range, 5-of-7 from the field and 1-of-3 from the line while AJ was 6-of-10 from two-point range for his total of 12. Sainty was allowed only three attempts from the free-throw line

the entire evening. "All of our guys played hard," Coach Cassidy said. "They played us man-to-man in the first quarter and we scored 19 points. The rest of the game they played zone and our scoring slowed down." Sainty matched Quinter in rebounds by actually having 26 to their 21. Eleven of Sainty's were offensive and 15 defensive. Sainty also collected 10 deflections with J. McAtee having four. "We had a good season and had

Wrestlers finish campaign with third place finish at State

The Oberlin 3-2-1A Regional Tournament and the State Tournament in Hays ended the season for the Sainty wrestlers after completing three months of intense practices and many duals and tournaments. As a result of their skill development, eight Sainty mat men qualified at Regionals to advance to State, with the hopes being named a champion or at least finishing in the top six.


Neb., at the Sterling dual tournament. In Northwest Kansas League action St. Francis ended the season 3-3. Falling to the Indians were Hoxie, Oakley and Rawlins County while Colby, Oberlin and Goodland were victorious. Sainty won championships in two tournaments, the Sterling Dual Tournament and the Prairie Classic. They placed fourth at the St. Francis Invitational, second at the Wray Invitational, third at the Northwest Kansas League Tournament, second at Regionals and third at State.

Wrestlers earning championships at one or more tournaments include Richard, Sherlock, Loyd, Gienger, Matt Brown, Rogers and Wilger. Two new school records were set during the 2005-06 season: Richard set a new record with 80 career falls and Loyd set a record with 19 career technical falls. Five seniors have finished their high school wrestling career: Richard, Loyd, Brown, Gabe Smull and Tal Earl.

Following is a wrapup of the statistics from all varsity matches during the 2005-06 season.
