ington, D.C., that she has been awarded a Child Development Associates (CDA) credential. The Child Development Associates is a national credentialing program that awards competency-based credentials to individuals who work with children ages birth to 5 years old.

The candidate for a Child Development Associates credential must have a minimum of 480 hours of experience with children, complete 120 clock hours of formal early childhood education, demonstrate competency in a state approved child care setting, and sign a statement of ethical conduct.

Ms. Hankins has been interested in child care since her first babysitting job when she was 8 years old. She has worked in the child care industry as a nanny and with TNT in the St. Francis since 1997. She was able to complete the Child Development Associates process with the assistance of Smart Start NW Kansas.

Smart Start is a grant funded agency dedicated to providing funding to promote quality early childhood education.

This year's honor classes are 1927, 1932, 1937, 1942, 1947, 1952, 1957, 1962, 1967, 1972, 1977, 1982, 1987, 1992 and 1997. Some classmates have already gathered to make tentative plans for the alumni.

Each year, Shirley Zweygardt, alumni reunion coordinator, asks for class representatives to help update the class roster. If the class is having additional activities, she can include it in the letters mailed to out-of-town and honor class alumni on April 1.
