The At&T Field Service Manager, Sandi Van Handel has encourage that the message gets out about a new scam.

If you get a phone call from an 809, 284 and 876 prefix do not call it back.

They will get you to call them by telling you that it is information about a family member who has been ill or to tell you someone has been arrested, died, or to let you know you have won a wonderful prize.

If you call from the US, you will be charged \$2,425 per minute. Or, you'll get a long recorded message. The point is, they will try to keep you on the phone as long as possible to increase the charges. Unfortunately, when you get your phone bill, you'll most likely be charged more than \$24,100/

The 809 area code is located in the British Virgin Islands.

If you complain to the local phone company and your long distance carrier they will not want to get involved because you did actually make the call. The phone company and the carrier simply providing the billing for the foreign company. You will end up dealing with a foreign company that will argue they have done nothing wrong.

The facility at Norton is a minimum security facility and has around 740 inmates who work on numerous projects in the surrounding area. They also repair wheelchairs like the inmates due at the penitentiary in Burlington, Colo.

The Lions Club members wish to acknowledge the help of the community and the Herald for the support to recycle bicycles, wheelchairs, glasses, hearing aids, cell phones and ink cartridges. And the people who received these items are thankful to the Lions and all who support them.

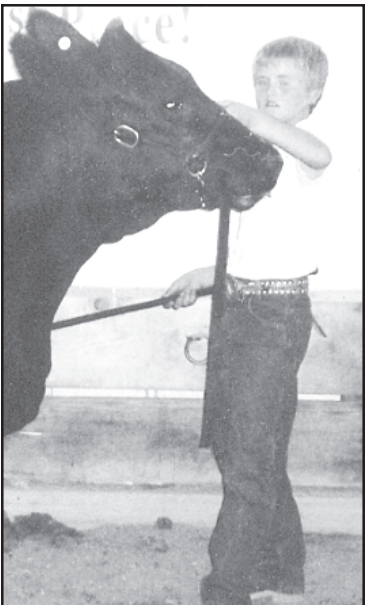
Sainty youth is Grand Champion
