BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS, that that paragraph (b) of Section 105 of Article 1, Chapter 15 of the 2003 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, and entitled "UTILITY DEPOSIT", shall be amended to read as follows:

(b) Cash deposits for the indicated utility services shall be in the follow-

Commercia (1) Water Service (2) Electric Service \$150

Upon a prospective customer providing the Office of the City Clerk with an acceptable guarantee and/or history of payment, the required utility deposit for residential service shall be reduced as follows:

(1) Water Service \$25 (2) Electric Service \$75

An acceptable guarantee shall be defined as follows:

A written promise to pay any unpaid utility bills of the prospective customer owed to the City by a current utility customer of the City with a minimum of 12 months utility history with the City and with the guarantor having no history of late payment, prior disconnects of service for non-payment of utility bills or having checks returned to the City for insufficient

An acceptable history of payment shall be defined as follows:

A verifiable written statement from the prospective customeris immediate past utility provider(s) reflecting a payment history of the prospective customer for the prior 12 month period. Said payment history must meet the same criteria as required of an acceptable guarantor as set out

This paragraph (b) of Section 15-105, as amended, shall take effect and be enforced from and after its publication in the official city newspaper, The St. Francis Herald.


