
Eagles defeat Cowboys

The dual was close until Zach Luedke put the Eagles up for good with a pin of Shandon Wolak at 152. Luedke pinned Wolak in 1:48 and


gave Colby a 24-22 lead. The Eagles built on their lead from then on, losing only one match, a 5-0 decision against Eric Seemann in
