


Track season is up and running for Colby Eagles

Jessie Brenn finished first in the 100 meter hurdles at 16.74 and helped win first in both the 4x100 and 4x400 relays.

In the 4x100, Brenn, Breann Hart, Brianna Swafford and Jess Stephenson ran a 53.42.

Stephens and Ivy Ramsey ran a 4:29.3. 4:39.4 Ramsey also ran the 1600 in 6:01.7 and the 800 in 2:32.6 for first.
