

Track season is up and running for Colby Eagles



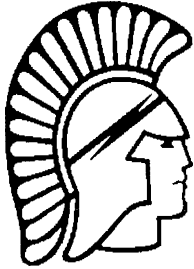

Trojans split double-header in Garden City

The Colby Community College Trojans split a double headers in Garden City this weekend. They won the first game in Garden City on Saturday 7-5 and lost 7-1 in the second. In game one, sophomore right hander Seth Vontz (1-4) gave up just two earned runs in six inning to record his first win of the season. He struck out three and walked one. James Allen recorded his second save. A three run home by Mike Dove in the top of the first put the Trojans in the lead, but Garden City battled back with runs in the first, fourth and fifth innings. A four run sixth inning put Colby up and Allen squelched an attempted rally by the Broncbusters in the bottom of the seventh.

Justin Lane, Justin Miller and Zack Andrews had three hits each, including two doubles by Andrews and one each by Lane and Miller. Lane also had two RBIs along with Dove's four. "The second game was not as kind to us," said assistant coach Ray Nolan. Chris



Johnson (1-4) took the loss with six earned runs on 10 hits, foru strikeouts and two walks in 5 2/3 innings. A scoreless game until the Broncbusters broke open four runs in the bottom of the third, Colby was never able to catch up. Justin Miller hit a solo shot in the fourth for the only Trojan score and Justin Lane had a double. The Trojans' next game is Wednesday against Cloud County in Concordia at 3 p.m. Next home action is Saturday when Seward County comes to Trojan Field at 1 p.m.

Girls take six top placings in Hays meet

The Colby High School girls track team left Hays Thursday with six first place, three second, a third,five fourth, four fifth and two sixth place finishes for a total of 21 medals. Jessie Brenn finished first in the 100 meter hurdles at 16.74 and helped win first in both the 4x100 and 4x400 re-lays. In the 4x100, Brenn, Breann Hart, Brianna Swafford and Jess Stephenson ran a 53.42. In the 4x400, Brenn, Hart, Summar

Stephens and Ivy Ramsey ran a 4:29.3. Ramsey also ran the 1600 in 6:01.7 and the 800 in 2:32.6 for first. Brenn had a second place finish in the 300 hurdles at 53.47 and Swafford finished the 100 in 13.15 and the 200 in 28.06, all good enough for second. Jamie Quenzer finished third in the 3200 at 15:14. Hart ran the 100 in 13.6 for fourth. Erika Erickson, Amanda Seeman, Lori Ziegelmeier and Summar Stephens rant he 4x100 in 56.71. Seemann, Erickson, Ziegelmeier and Jami Williams ran the 4x400 in

4:39.4. Stephenson also ran the 100 hurdles in 17.4 and Swafford did the long jump in 15' 11/4" Fifth place went to Karen Davis, Jodi Nicholson, Bethanie Linden and Williams in the 4x100 at 59.96. Hart ran the 200 in 28.76. Becky Lange pole vaulted 6' 6" and Stephenson ran the 300 hurdles in 62 seconds. Erickson was sixth in the 200 at 28.84 and Lang in the 1600 at 3:02.6. The Lady Eagles travel to Norton on Friday at 3 p.m.

Senior leadership helps boys win 21 medals

The Colby High School boys' track team also earned 21 medals, including three first place finishes, in their first outing of the season at the Hays Invitational on Thursday. The Eagles also won three seconds, four thirds, five fourths, five fifths and a sixth place medal in the outing. Senior Zach Brown, out for track for the first time, helped lead the Eagles with a first place medal in the 200 at 22.16 seconds and the high jump at 5'10". Brown, along with Damien Stephens and Wade and Brent McCoy, ran the 4x100 relay with a total time of

44.85 for Colby's final first place medal. Brown and Stephens also ran the 4x400, along with Trace Austin and Jason Simmering, in 3:33.6 for second place. Stephens won a second place medal in the 400 with a time of 53.9 seconds and Wade McCoy ran the 100 in 11.03. Bo Kleisorge, Rusty Raymo, Austin and Simmering ran the 4x100 in 47.54 for third. Keegan Myers took third in the triple jump at 38'2", Jeff Reavis in the high jump at 5'4" and Austin ran the 400 in 54.7, all for third. Fourth place went to Brent McCoy in the long jump at 18' 8 1/2", Wade

McCoy, Raymo, Theo Kleinsorge and Brandon Williams ran the 4x400 in 3:47.42, Simmering ran the 400 in 44.27, Stephens ran the 100 in 11.23 and Nic Tubbs went 37'2" in the triple jump. Fifth place went to Brent McCoy in the 100 at 11:30, Raymo in the 400 at 55.81. Eric Seeman in the shot at 41' 11/4", Adam Smith in the discus at 123'5" and Nathan Trail in the high jump at 5'2". Chris Griggs, Smith, Tubbs and Brandon Mazanec ran the 4x100 in 49.14 for sixth. Next outing for the track team is in Norton at 3 p.m. on Friday.

Duke wins third national championship

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — No come-back. No blowout. Just another Duke title in the Twin Cities. The Blue Devils won their third national championship — and second in

the Metrodome — with an 82-72 victory over Arizona on Monday night. With All-Americans Jason Williams and Shane Battier having off nights, sophomores Mike Dunleavy and

Carlos Boozer picked up the slack and Mike Krzyzewski moved into impressive coaching company. Still well behind UCLA's John Wooden's 10 national championships, Krzyzewski moved one behind Kentucky's Adolph Rupp and tied his college coach, Bob Knight, who won three at Indiana. The loss ended Arizona's bittersweet season and kept the Wildcats from matching their own record of beating three No. 1 seeds in the NCAA tournament as they did when they won it all in 1997.
