

College baseball earns split

The Colby Community College Troans split a double-header against Barton County at Trojan Field on Sunday, losing their first game against Barton County 7-6 at Trojan Field, then bouncing back to win the second game

The Trojans started Rob Mortimore in game one against Barton. He managed seven hits, five earned runs, six strikeouts and only one walk in five innings. Allen came in with the score 6-5 in Colby's favor.

He pitched two innings in relief, with a strikeout, a walk. A two-run homer by Barton left the Trojans short in the seventh. Colby wasn't able to come back in the bottom of the seventh and Allen (3-2) took the loss.

Freshmen Cullen Gibreath, Brian Berryman and sophomore Justin Miller had two hits each, including a double by Berryman. Dove and Josh Prickett had two RBIs each.

Game two found Andy Wernke (2-4) allowing only one earned run on five scattered hits with eight strikeouts and only two walks.

Berryman hit his third home run of the season, a two run shot in the sixth to seal the win. A three-run second put Colby in the lead and Barton's rally in the seventh fell short.

Justin Lane had three hits, including a double and two RBIs. Berryman also had two RBIs.

The Trojans' next game is Saturday when Seward County comes to Trojan Field at 1 p.m.

TAMPA, Fla. (AP)—Darryl Strawberry told his probation officer he spent the four days he was missing doing cocaine with a female friend and armed men who took his jewelry and abandoned him in a motel room.

Florida probation officials said that Strawberry tested positive for cocaine use and violated the terms of his house arrest in his four-day absence from a drug rehab center.

The report came as Strawberry remained in a psychiatric ward at St. Joseph's Hospital while doctors evaluated him. He will be sent to the Hillsborough County Jail and held March 20 after the Volunteers' fourth without bail once doctors declare him mentally stable.

The probation report is the first official accounting of Strawberry's Thursday night disappearance from the drug treatment center where he was serving two years' house arrest.

Strawberry said he was picked up at the center by a woman from an Alcoholics Anonymous program named Beverly, who was supposed to take him to the meeting.


