1 ten-inch unbaked pie crust 1/2 pound asparagus, washed, trimmed and cut

into two-inch pieces 3 green onions, sliced Lois Myers 5 slices bacon, crisply fried and drained

> Correspondent 6 eggs 2 cups half-and-half 4 tablespoons sour cream

1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper Salt and pepper to taste 1/2 teaspoon minced chives 1 cup Swiss cheese, shredded 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese, shredded

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Place asparagus in boiling water for 3 minutes, drain and cool. Place prepared pie shell on cookie sheet for easier handling. Crumble the bacon pieces into pie shell, add sliced onions. Mix cheeses and sprinkle over bacon and onion. Place asparagus pieces on top of cheese. In large bowl beat eggs; stir in half-and-half, sour cream, spices and chives. Pour egg mixture on top and fill the crust to ^1/2 inch from edge. 


