New Jersey one game away from third title

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. (AP) — The New Jersey Devils are one victory, one more game when all goes right, from doing something special. Something that would make a handful of engraved names on a silver challenge stand out all the more, perhaps glitter a little brighter.

Something that separates the great teams from merely the good ones. They would be Stanley Cup champions, perhaps as soon as tonight.

And if dynasty is too all-encompassing a word to describe what they would have done, it would be close.

For only the fourth time since expansion in the 1960s, the NHL would have a three-time champion.

The others already hold a special place in the game: the Montreal Canadiens of Ken Dryden, the Edmonton Oilers of a guy named Gretzky, the New York Islanders of Bryan Trottier.

Still, there are two significant challenges to the Devils as they take a 3-2 lead into Game 6 of the Stanley Cup finals against the Colorado Avalanche tonight, when they could win their third cup since 1995.

The first, of course, is Colorado, which only a week ago seemed on the

verge of winning this very cup.

The second is the Devils' sporadic history on home ice.

To avoid a Game 7 in unfriendly Denver on Saturday night, when they would be favorites no more, the Devils

must win in an arena that hasn't been supplied much of a home-ice advantage during the last two postseasons. They are 13-10 at the Meadowlands, 1-1 in this series, compared to 18-5 on the road.

Colorado streak now four games

DENVER (AP) — Ben Petrick hit two homers and drove in three runs to back Brian Bohanon as the Colorado Rockies beat the Houston Astros 9-8 Wednesday night for their fourth straight win.

The Rockies chased Scott Elarton with a five-run fifth inning that included Petrick's two-run drive.

Bohanon (3-4), winning his second straight start since coming off the disabled list (inflamed elbow), departed after walking the leadoff batter in the seventh.

He allowed two runs and six hits. Elarton (4-5) gave up six runs and nine hits in 4 2-3 innings.

Jose Jimenez pitched the ninth for his 10th save in 13 chances, allowing an RBI single to Charlie Hayes.

With two on and two outs, Craig Biggio hit a game-ending comebacker. Rockies manager Buddy Bell was ejected by first base umpire Tim Joyce for arguing a call at first base in the ninth.

Colorado built a 9-2 lead before the Astros scored five runs in the eighth, getting a solo homer from Richard Hidalgo.

The Astros, who have lost three straight games and 12 of their last 17, went ahead in the first when Julio Lugo doubled and Jeff Bagwell hit a bloop RBI single.

Petrick hit a leadoff homer in the third, and the Rockies took a 6-1 lead in a five-run fifth.

Conglomerate building new stadium for teams


TRENTON, N.J. (AP) — The Devils and Nets will play their home games in a \$355 million arena in downtown Newark.

Owners and state officials say the deal won't cost taxpayers any money.

Construction will start soon, and the New Jersey-based teams could be playing there by 2004, said a representative of YankeeNets, the sports conglomerate that owns both the NHL and NBA teams.

YankeeNets will pay \$115 million of the plan.

The remaining \$240 million will be paid from tax revenues generated by the new arena from sales of luxury boxes, tickets and merchandise and from sales in the surrounding area, which will be designated as a "sports/entertainment district."
