

Jayhawks get new director

LAWRENCE (AP) — Allen Bohl, who helped lead a resurgence at Fresno State's football program as athletic director, was named Thursday to the same position at the University of Kansas.

Bohl, 53, was introduced at John Hadl Auditorium on the Kansas campus. He replaces Bob Frederick, whose resigned after 14 years to become a teacher in the Kansas School of Education.

Bohl will start work Aug. 1. Terms of his contract have not been finalized, but Kansas Chancellor Robert Hemenway said Bohl would make a \$255,000 base salary, nearly doubling his pay at Fresno State.

"Al Bohl will initiate a new and exciting time for KU athletics," Hemenway said.

After learning the job was his, Bohl said he talked to Kansas State athletic director Tim Weiser, a longtime friend who often competed with Bohl as they worked for schools in the same conferences. Weiser asked Bohl when he would start work.

"I said, 'Tim, I've already started,'" Bohl said. "Every one of those purple Wildcat signs I see, I'm tearing them down."

Before the news conference, Bohl told *The Fresno* (Calif.) *Bee* that leaving Fresno State was difficult "because of the good things we have going at Fresno State, but Kansas being in the Big 12 was key," he said.

He reiterated those feelings in Lawrence, praising Roy Williams for maintaining a quality program.

Looking at mascots

Last week we started by looking at the origins of probably the three most popular college teams in our area, Kansas State, KU and Nebraska.

This week, we'll look at the rest of the old Big Eight.

I don't know how you feel about it, but I didn't like it when we added the Texas teams. Of course, some of us can probably remember the Big Six.

I think it was Iowa State and Colorado that we added to make the Big Eight, but I really don't know. If anyone does, give me a call.

Now, to continue our look at mascots.

Missouri's Tiger, like the Kansas Jayhawk, has Civil War roots. Based on a nickname given to a group of Columbia citizens who banded together to defend their town against marauding guerilla bands.

Their tenacity earned them the name tigers. The mascot is named Truman, in honor of Harry S. Truman, the Missouri native and president of the United States.

Iowa States Cyclone came about in 1895, when a number of tornadoes

(called cyclones) hit Iowa in the summer.

That fall, Iowa State routed a heavily favored Northwestern team and the headline in the *Chicago Tribune* read "Iowa Cyclone Devastates Evanston town."

Cy the Cyclone was introduced at a pep rally in 1954. The cardinal figure still represents the school colors and is the original mascot.

Colorado used to be the Silver and Gold until the buffalo was the official winner in a contest. Ralphie I made her debut in 1966.

Initially, she was billed as Ralph, but upon discovery that she was female, the name was promptly changed.

Oklahoma State's Pistol Pete is based on the colorful, legendary and very real Frank Eaton, a U.S. Deputy Marshall.

In 1923, a group of students saw Eaton leading an Armistice Day Parade and asked him to pose for the mascot.

Oklahoma has had several mascots up to the current Sooner Schooner. The first was a dog with a red sweater emblazoned with a big "O" on the side. His job was to chase other dogs off the field.

The current schooner, reminiscent of the conestoga wagons used by early settlers, is powered by two white ponies and explodes onto Owen Field after each Oklahoma score.

Safety tips offered for boating

TOPEKA — The Fourth of July is a one of the biggest celebrations of summer. Unfortunately, boating accidents are often an unwanted by-product of this celebration. If past years' averages hold, about 60 people could lose their lives this holiday on the nation's waterways. However, most of these fatalities can be avoided with some common sense.

To make this holiday safer, the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks offers these tips to boaters:

- Wear a life jacket. Most accidents occur when someone falls overboard or capsizes their boat. Nearly nine out of 10 people who drown were not wearing a life jacket.

- Do not mix alcohol and boating. More than 50 percent of fatal boating accidents involved alcohol use by the boat operator or passengers.
