

Kansas Succotash

1 tablespoon olive or canola oil 1 (16 oz.) package frozen pearl onions, thawed

> 1 (14.5 oz.) can chicken broth

2 red bell peppers, cored and diced

2 cups fresh or frozen corn

3 small zucchini, cut into 1/4 inch rounds 1/4 cup sour cream Salt and pepper to taste

Heat oil in Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Add onions and cook, stirring occasionally, until golden. (Add a little water, if needed, to prevent scorching.) Add broth and peppers. Bring to simmer and cook for five minutes. Add corn and zucchini. Return to a simmer and cook, covered, until vegetables are tender, (about 25 minutes.) Stir in sour cream and season with salt and pepper. Makes about six, 1 cup servings.
