



U.S. Open. The No. 10-seeded Williams will try to take the next step Friday against topseeded Martina Hingis, who advanced by beating Daja Bedanova 6-2, 6-0 in 42 minutes.

On the men's side, 19-year-old American Andy Roddick reached the quarterfinals of a Grand Slam for the first time, beating Tommy Robredo 6-2, 6-2, 6-4.

Roddick hit a 141 mph serve third-fastest in tournament history and became the youngest men's quarterfinalist at the Open since Andre Agassi in 1988. He'll next play the winner of the match between Tommy Haas and Lleyton Hewitt.

Haas led 6-3, 2-2 when play was suspended until Wednesday because of rain.
