
Family



2/3 cup sugar

In large bowl, beat eggs, sugar, syrup, margarine and salt until well blended. Stir in pecans. Spoon mixture into unbaked pie shell. Bake on bottom rack of 375 degree oven until center is almost set, (about 50 minutes.) Remove from oven and cool on a wire rack for 90 minutes. Cut into wedges and serve. (Best if served at room temperature.)
